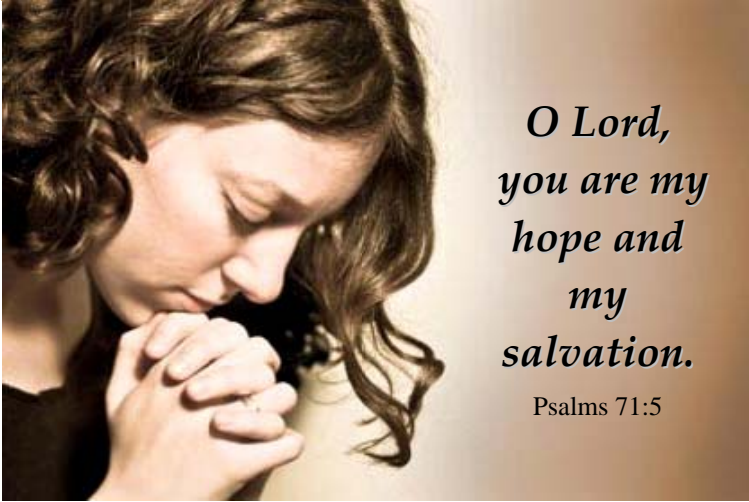

Today's Reflection:

Genuine humility cannot embrace lies so Jesus speaks the truth at Nazareth. He tells his hometown neighbors to ask themselves why He is not performing the same miracles He has done in Capernaum. They deny the implicit offer of conversion and try to kill him. Jesus directly looks at them (and also does the same to us) and, when necessary, says, "No, it's not all right, the way you are. But you don't need to stay that way. Hear and accept the Good News."

What would Jesus say to me, right now, today, about my readiness to live in the Kingdom?

Next Sunday's Reading – February 7, 2010

First Reading: Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8

Isaiah receives his prophetic call in a vision during Temple worship. In his vision, the Temple becomes God's Holy Court. The doors shake and smoke fills the Temple, signs for the people of that time of God's divine presence. He is anxious for his life because he is one of a sinful people who speak with "unclean lips." The touch of a burning coal to his lips removes his sins so he can speak the truth and be single hearted. The "clean" Isaiah answers God's call to be His prophet.

God calls *us* to be His witnesses in our world. Seeing God's power requires prayer; doing God's will requires honesty and purpose.

How has God called you to be his witness, his prophet?

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

Paul tries to refocus the Corinthians on the Good News and its implications for life. When He preaches the Good

News, people respond in faith and meet Christ. The preaching and the reception are instruments of Christ acting in the world because the people realize He is present. What they see and touch and hear *changes* them. After they encounter the Risen Lord, they become the face of Christ to others.

Paul draws a direct, clear line of ministry to the appearance of Jesus in his own life as well. The experience rips apart his world view and belief system. He no longer is a zealous Pharisee under the Law but is now a Christian preacher. He charges his audience to carry on the mission, bringing the Good News to others and living it to the extent that it inspires others to believe.

How has your experience with the Risen Lord changed your world view?

Gospel: Luke 5:1-11

Simon has worked all night without catching a single fish. Then, he meets Jesus and the fish come in abundance. So does a call. Jesus enters the boat of Simon and begins to preach to the crowd. The willingness to let Jesus use the boat as a platform sets up their later willingness to go back out to fish at a time of day not likely to yield anything. Overwhelmed at the catch, Peter declares his sinful status before this man who has the power of God; Jesus calls him to become a fisher of men.

On a deeper level we cannot underestimate the impact of the fishermen, Simon, Andrew, James and John, upon the Christian tradition. For example, their boats help Jesus, a traveling preacher, visit towns and hamlets along the lake shore. Also, as a food, fish is common in the region and figures in the stories of the multiplication of the loaves and John's post-resurrection narrative. Jesus uses fish in his parable on prayer and in the story of paying the Temple Tax. The faithful of the early Church use the fish as their Christian sign. Even the boat can become a symbol for the Church. We, like Peter, receive a call to follow the Lord.

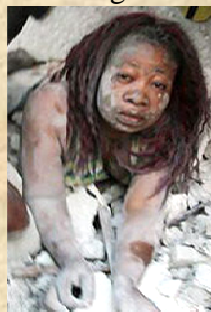
